

# **Changing Lives**

After suffering years of domestic violence, Rosa, a Honduran mother of three U.S. citizen children, was finally eligible to apply for her green card...until she was unjustly arrested. The officers failed to recognize her trauma response or to provide interpretation-leaving Rosa confused, frightened, and suddenly confronted with the agonizing possibility of being deported and separated from her young children. When Rosa's attorney reached out, ASISTA provided key legal arguments and strategizing support.

Rosa's green card was approved and she can now build a safe, secure future for herself and her children in the country they call home.
